English Language Assessments

An English Language Assessment is a requirement for a client wanting to register for English classes or the Job Search Workshops (JSW). Clients are assessed according to Canadian Language Benchmarks and are tested in four skill areas: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. The Assessment is free of charge for eligible Welcome Centre clients.

Please note:

- Proof of immigrant status must be presented at the time of assessment
- The assessment can take from 1-4 hours.
- Childcare is available for eligible clients
- Appointments must be booked in advance.
